<p>Health care</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You can self-assess to decide whether you should be tested for COVID-19 at Yukon.ca/COVID-19. A respiratory assessment centre is being set up in Whitehorse for people with acute respiratory illness, such as influenza or COVID-19, who need medical assessment. Whitehorse General Hospital will suspend all scheduled, non-urgent surgeries from March 23. Urgent surgery and emergency care will continue. No visitors are allowed at Yukon hospitals, with limited exceptions. Visit Yukon.ca to learn more. 	
<p>Social distancing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Gatherings over 50 people are not allowed. Self-isolate if you are sick. Maintain a 2-metre spacing from others. Indoor recreation facilities and libraries are closed until further notice. Public schools are closed until April 15. See a list of closures, cancellations and facility restrictions at Yukon.ca/COVID-19. 	
<p>Travel and borders</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Canada-U.S. border is closed to non-essential travel. The border will remain open for trade and commerce. Avoid all international travel. There are no travel restrictions in place within Canada. If you have travelled outside Canada, including Alaska, in the last 14 days, you should self-isolate at home for 14 days. Visit Canada.ca. 	
<p>Businesses and financial relief</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Governments of Yukon and Canada have taken steps to support local workers and businesses. Visit Canada.ca to learn more about these measures.
